

Advanced Handgun Survival Shooting Course

September 10-12, 2008 (Second Notice)

Instructor: Sheriff Kevin Erickson, Luce County. Sheriff Erickson has trained at the Federal Firearms Training Academy and taught extensively at the recruit and in-service levels for the past nine years.

Course Description: A 3 day (20 hour) program designed to effectively train each participant in the skills and dynamics of survival pistol shooting. Including the process of utilizing tactical vision as applied to the use of firearms. The program will also cover the difference between survival/instinctive pistol usage as opposed to the stand, point and shoot which has been the standard in law enforcement training. Officer survival training techniques and survival shooting fundamentals will be taught in this program.
