

# TRAINING ANNOUNCEMENT

The Michigan State Police, Criminal Justice Information Center, through a grant provided by MCOLES, is pleased to announce the continuation of a training program designed for Law Enforcement personnel who issue Licenses to Purchase and Concealed Pistol Licenses, and whom impact department policies and conduct weapons related investigations.

The Program is:

## UNDERSTANDING STATE AND FEDERAL FIREARMS PROHIBITORS 2009

This program is funded through a MCOLES grant, and is FREE to all Law Enforcement personnel. This year the program is a 7 hour training day.

### **Audience:**

To date, over 1,450 law enforcement personnel have attended this program. It is especially useful to law enforcement personnel involved in the issuance of Licenses to Purchase (LTP) and Concealed Pistol Licenses (CPL), as well as officials making policy decisions. Representatives of county gun boards, law enforcement administrators (policy makers), records/civilian personnel (responsible for the issuance of Licenses to purchase), and investigators should also consider attending this course.

### **Synopsis:**

This MCOLES recognized program discusses the Brady Handgun Violence Prevention Act, Michigan Firearms Act of 1927, as amended, the concealed pistol licensing act, and how these impact an individual's ability to obtain a license to purchase or a concealed pistol license.

State and Federal factors that may be considered in denying a License to Purchase or a Concealed Pistol License are discussed in depth. The latest requirements and restrictions to conducting a NICS check are reviewed. Restoration of convicted felon's firearms rights is also discussed.

**This year we will again have an emphasis on interpreting final dispositions on criminal histories, domestic violence convictions, and implementation of the new LTP process .We have had significant changes in the License to Purchase process with the changes in the laws effective January 07, 2009.**

### **INSTRUCTOR:**

**James Tieman** (Jim) retired from the Ann Arbor Police Department in 2001, as a Detective Lieutenant. Mr. Tieman has a Bachelors Degree in Interdisciplinary Technology from Eastern Michigan University. Mr. Tieman was responsible for direction of the APRS system and pistol registration at the Ann Arbor Police Department. Mr. Tieman also conducted lethal force and firearms policy training for the in-house and in-service training for AAPD. In addition Mr. Tieman represented the Ann Arbor Police Department as a non-voting member of the Washtenaw County Gun Board. Mr. Tieman has also attended national training seminars for NICS.

### **PRESENTATION:**

This presentation is designed to be accessible to all law enforcement agencies. Presentations will be on a regional basis. A minimum of 20 registered participants is required for the training to be conducted.
